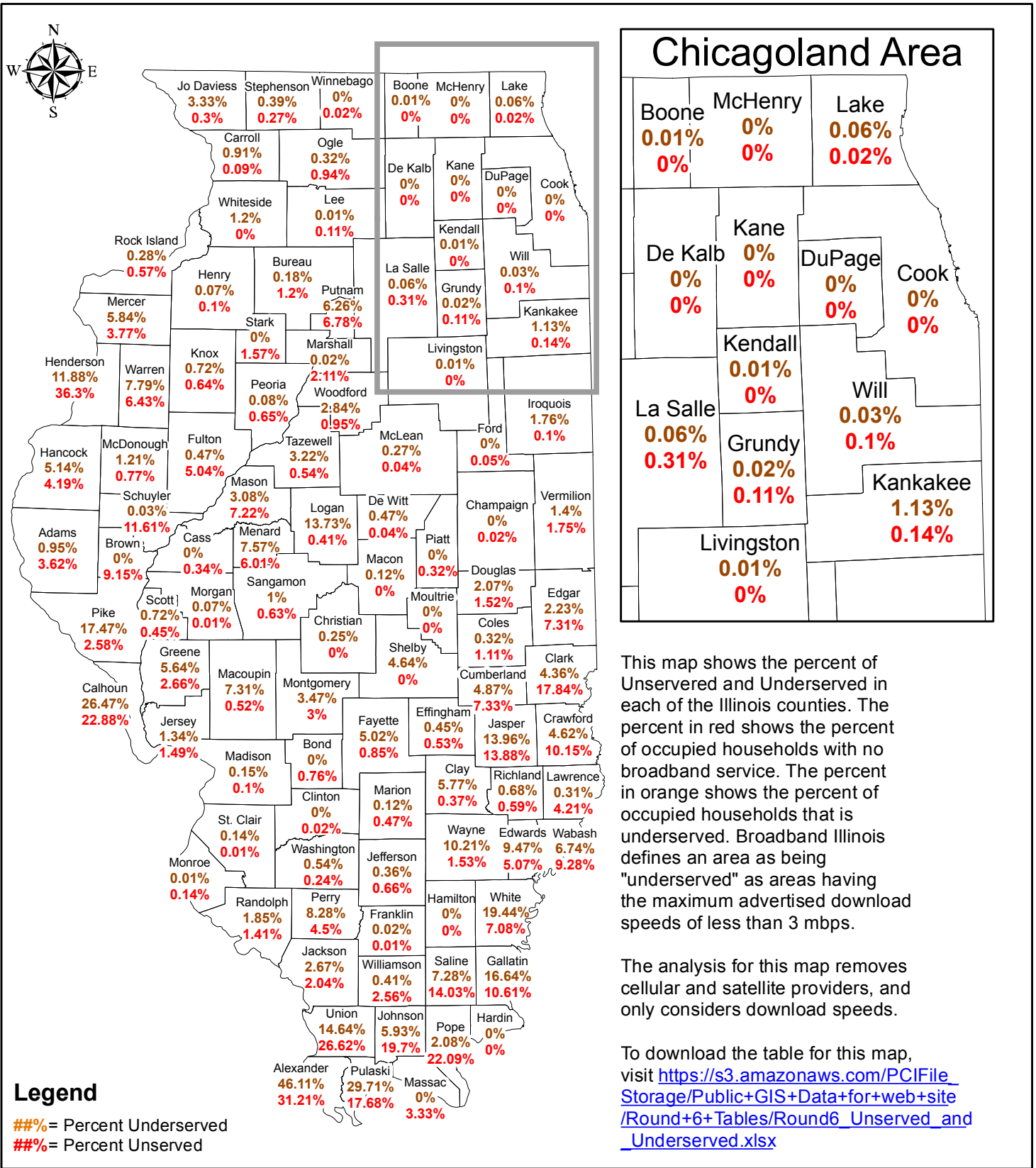




# Unserved and Underserved Households in Illinois

Round Six – Data Current as of June 30, 2012  
(Excluding Cellular and Satellite)



This map shows the percent of Unserved and Underserved in each of the Illinois counties. The percent in red shows the percent of occupied households with no broadband service. The percent in orange shows the percent of occupied households that is underserved. Broadband Illinois defines an area as being "underserved" as areas having the maximum advertised download speeds of less than 3 mbps.

The analysis for this map removes cellular and satellite providers, and only considers download speeds.
