



Youth Mental Health Crisis: Using Digital Mental Health Resources in Rural, Urban, & Suburban Schools

Surging mental health demand among youth and a chronic clinician shortage has resulted in a capacity crisis requiring innovative solutions in schools. In 2023, the Partnership for a Connected Illinois (PCI) provided [an overview](#) of the needs in schools and the emerging digital and supplemental tele-behavioral mental health vendor field to improve access to student support. In 2024, we provided [a deeper dive](#) into digital mental health resources being introduced in schools nationwide and discussed implementation issues. This year, a panel discussion, including participants from rural, urban, and suburban Illinois school districts, will share their needs, experiences, and lessons learned in introducing these supplemental resources in the '23-'24 and '24-'25 school years. They will share tips to overcome barriers associated with their particular geography to assure effective engagement and impact.

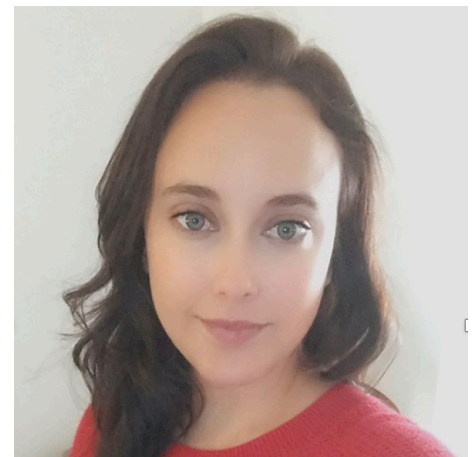
